

PSYCHOLOGY POST- MASTER'S CERTIFICATE IN CLINICAL MENTAL HEALTH IN PREPARATION FOR COUNSELING LICENSURE

Curriculum

(*Note: As of Fall 2018, this program is only accepting new students on a limited basis. Admission will be restricted to graduates of the former WCU Clinical Psychology M.A. program.)

This individualized post-master's program, culminating in a certificate, consists of a minimum of 12 credits. The program is tailored to individual students based on their prior master's level coursework and their interests. The admissions process includes the development of an individualized, planned course of study designed to allow students to complete course work in areas necessary to be eligible for Pennsylvania licensure as a professional counselor.
